


# **LEARNING RESOURCE**



### Scary Sculpted Eyeballs

This project shows you how to create spooky Halloween eyeballs using ping pong balls, tissue and paint. This fun transformational challenge is suitable for all ages.

To help you get started, you might find it helpful to draw, paint or collect images of eyes or eyeballs. If working with younger children, eyes could be painted on paper before being cut out and stuck on, and any number of materials could be used for the 'nerves' such as strands of red tissue, wool or thread.

## What will I need for this project?

Toilet roll
PVA glue
Pot of water
Ping pong balls

Ping pong balls
Red, black, white and blue acrylic or enamel paint
Very fine paintbrush and medium sized paintbrush
Palette or tray for mixing paint

Newspaper to cover surfaces







## **LEARNING RESOURCE**

### Step one:

Gather your materials together and prepare your workspace by laying out newspaper or an old tablecloth.



## Step three:

Twist some strands of toilet roll before dipping them in PVA glue. Attach to the back of the eye to form the nerves. Leave to dry or use a hairdryer to speed up the process!




#### Step two:

Tear off a strand of toilet roll and wrap this around your ping pong ball to form the back of the eye. Paint on a mixture of PVA glue and water to attach.



#### **Step four:**

When the toilet roll and PVA glue has dried and become solid, paint the back of the eye and the nerves using red paint.


